A note from Pastor Reed

How Then Shall We Pray?

FBCO, thank you for warmly welcoming me to be your interim pastor. When I arrived in November you were kind and embracing as I began preaching, spending a bit of time with elders, doing some pre-marital counseling and so on. It has been a great joy for me to serve in this way. When I came, you were in the midst of 40 days of fasting and prayer. Those 40 days have come and gone... so let's eat! But let's not stop praying!

Do you remember Samuel? A pivotal figure in biblical history to be sure. He was the last of the judges, something of a priest and also a prophet. Samuel was the bridge that led Israel from the chaos of the period of the judges to the united monarchy under Saul, David and Solomon. But Samuel was also a man of prayer. In fact, this towering figure in the Old Testament understood prayerlessness to be a sin. Recall Samuel's farewell address to the nation when he said,

Far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord by ceasing to pray for you. (1 Samuel 12:23)

FBCO what can we learn from Samuel?

First, we learn that prayer is not an elective in the Christian life. We are called, indeed commanded, to be people of prayer. Samuel doesn't see prayer as an add-on to his real agenda. Prayer is his agenda. Read through Paul's letters and you will find the same emphasis. Paul is constantly, devoting himself to praying for the churches to which he is writing. And he urges his readers to be people of prayer. So much so that the Apostle tells us to pray without ceasing! (1 Thes. 5:17).

Second, prayer is only prayer when we pray. A tongue twister to be sure, but I have found that it is easier to talk about praying than it is to actually pray. As Catherine Marshall writes,

One can believe in the divinity of Jesus Christ and feel no personal loyalty to Him at all -- indeed, pay no attention whatever to His commandments and His will for one's life. One can believe intellectually in the efficacy of prayer and never do any praying.

FBCO, we are in a time of transition, a period of waiting, of calling on God to supply a pastor to love, lead and shepherd our church. To that end, let us pray. Let us ask and keep asking, knock and keep knocking. And when God answers our prayer, let us keep praying. As the Puritan Samuel Chadwick writes,

The one concern of the devil is to keep the saints from praying. He fears nothing from our prayerless work, or prayerless religion. He laughs at our toil, he mocks our wisdom, but he trembles when we pray.

Third, Samuel invites us to pray big prayers. Not just prayers asking God to make our sick friends well, those prayers are necessary and good, but Samuel invites us to pray prayers that will move heaven and earth. Right after he commits himself to praying for the nation of Israel he says,

Only fear the Lord and serve him faithfully with all your heart. For consider what great things he has done for you. (1 Samuel 12:24)

Here is a definitive hint regarding the content of Samuel's prayer. He is asking God to keep the people's hearts supple, soft and faithful. In the midst of this dialogue with the nation Samuel warns the people,

...Do not turn aside from following the Lord, but serve the Lord with all your heart. (1 Samuel 12:20)

Let's pray big prayers for FBCO and for other gospel-centered churches of Ojai. Let us ask that God will do more than we can ask or even imagine in our church and in our town.

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen. (Ephesians 3:20)

Church family, FBCO, let us pray!





husband and best friend to share this life with. God has given him gifts that awe me every day. Personally, he is my greatest supporter. He encourages me through the darkness and is so very, very patient. A beautiful example of a man who walks with Jesus. He takes my breath away.

Some may not acknowledge God's warning of generational sins, the commandments of God, or weakness and behavioral patterns handed down. Raised in an unstable home. Alcoholic parents, uncles, aunts, grandparents many of whom died from complications of alcoholism. Was I predisposed to depression and addictions? Learned behavior as a child, rebellion as a teen addictions took a deep hold on my body, mind and a very dark place in my soul. The fight is real. It's a fight for your life and those you love. The dependency and desires fade, but the battle for your mind is continuous.

Matthew 26:41 Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.

Every day is a choice.

Philip and I lost our brothers to alcoholism just two months apart. Did we do enough? Why? So much life lost, so much help available. It comes down to bowing our knee, humbling ourselves, asking for help and being accountable. It's a choice. I thank God He gave me another day.
